### **Deputy Headteacher Update**

Dear Parents and Carers,

Firstly, I would like to take this opportunity to say how lovely it is to see all our children back in school following the summer break. It is wonderful to see them playing with their friends and enjoying their learning once again.

As you know from my last update, at Birley Spa we have established a clear, shared vision regarding our Recovery Curriculum based upon the following four areas:

- 1. PSHE & Safeguarding (pastoral recovery curriculum)
- 2. Reading, Writing & Maths Recovery curriculum
- 3. Wider Recovery curriculum
- 4. Home-Learning Recovery curriculum

Our number one priority when children returned to school at the start of September was to ensure that they settled back into school routines and structure. Through a re-developed PSHE & Safeguarding curriculum, each class teacher is now in the process of working through the following themes with their class:

- a. Supporting children to build positive relationships with others
- b. Supporting children to manage their feelings and behaviour
- c. Supporting children to enjoy and achieve
- d. Supporting children's physical health and well-being

I know that all the teachers have been so impressed with the way children have responded to the sessions delivered so far and how eager the children have been to learn.

I mentioned in my last update that in terms of the academic curriculum, we had carried out a thorough review of our curriculum coverage across all subjects. Staff have had the opportunity to engage in lots of CPD opportunities prior to the summer break which they have used to adapt and change their planning (in light of the lockdown period). We are very confident that the changes we have made to Reading, Writing and Maths will really inspire children to achieve highly and close the gaps that have emerged as a result of the lockdown period.

At Birley Spa, we pride ourselves on delivering the highest quality of education we can deliver and it has been great to see how children have engaged with their new topics and wider curriculum learning since we have returned. 


