Dear Parents and Carers.

It has been another week full of fabulous learning in our school this week.

COVID-19

Please remember that if your child is showing one of the 3 main symptoms of COVID-19 then they should not attend school.

The government guidance also stipulates that unless you have symptoms then a test should not be taken.

If there are cases within school then we will notify you of any closures to bubbles or if your child has been identified as a close contact of a confirmed case. Additional cleaning has been introduced across the academy to ensure that the spread is contained and where a case is confirmed then the area that that case has been using is deep cleaned. Please remind your children about the importance of hand hygiene and we continue to wash our hands thoroughly and regularly throughout the school day.

If your child is isolating at home then they will receive their learning through our online learning platform Showbie or Tapestry. If you do not have your log in details then please contact the school office. If you are unable to access this due to a lack of internet access or a relevant device then again please let the office staff know. Paper packs can also be prepared.

Please remember to adhere to the one-way system if accompanying your child to school, wear a face covering and leave the school site as quickly as possible. We are working with the children on 'Hands Face Space' within school.

Attendance

Thank you to the parents and carers who are truly supporting their children's education by ensuring they attend school on time each day. It is vital that the children are in school so that they can experience the amazing learning experiences that the teachers are planning. If parents do not comply with this legal duty then I will work with external agencies such as the School Nursing Services, Social Care, MAST or SEND services to ensure that the children are safe and are having their entitlement to education fulfilled. If we are concerned about your child's attendance then we will contact you for an Initial Concerns' Meeting and then monitor for an agreed period. A reminder that holidays in term time will not be authorised.

This week Year 2 have been working really hard to apply our phonics skills into our reading and writing.
