The CREATE collaborate representatives will undertake a project to investigate and design a healthy menu for the children of Birley Spa along with our catering team from Taylor Shaw.

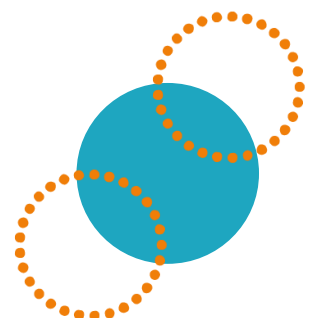

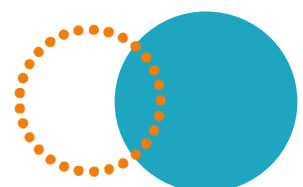
