#### **Bronze Learners**


We are delighted to announce that we have our first Bronze Learners, Olivia and Hanna, they have both shown our school values 60 times.


We were so proud today when they presented their evidence in Assembly and we were all delighted when they received their bronze learner wrist bands to wear with pride.
