# Year 1/2 Design Club

#### **Bikeability:**

This week our children from Year 6 had a visit from the 'Cycle North' team. They came into school to help children with their ability and confidence riding a cycle bike and how to practice road cycling safety.

The children first had a 'Playground session' where the Cycle North team could monitor the children and see where they needed guidance, they then assisted those children on their skills and confidence until they were confident with road riding.
