Dear parents and carers,

We are pleased to share with you how brilliantly our children have returned to school after the holiday break.

Children have returned eager and ready to learn, many of them exceeding expectations, practising and showing the school's values every day.

Another special mention to our Year sixes, who are handling and preparing for their SAT's excellently. Students are working extra hard, in and outside of school - **Well Done!**

Football tournament:

On Tuesday and Thursday, the school participated in an inter-school football tournament; the children really enjoyed representing our school, while having fun, new interactions with children from other schools. We are proud to say, our brilliant football team showed great respect and kindness to all other team. The Year 5 and 6 girls came second in their competition and the Year 5 boys came 1st in theirs.

A message from Year 5:

In Year 5 this term, we are learning all about Space within our Science lessons. We have been lucky enough to have a Professor of Astrophysics from Sheffield University come into school to talk to each class about the solar system. We have also carried this learning into our English lessons where the children have written biographies about Neil Armstrong. Some of the work the children have produced can be seen here.



Within our History lessons, we are learning about why people go on journeys. We have looked at the journeys the children have taken in their lives so far and are now looking at important journeys throughout History such as the Kinder Transport and the HMT Empire Windrush. A topic leaflet has been sent home via Showbie with links to further the children learning and to some exciting home learning tasks.



A message from Year 6:

Year 6 have had a brilliant start to the Summer term! Our 'Egyptian Day' and celebration event of last term's topic (Are We Damaging Our World?) was brilliant! It was lovely to see so many parents helping produce our campaign posters and paint the 3-D clay sculptures. We of course played the famous mummy wrapping game and the children worked together in teams to produce the best mummy! The children received lots of Teamwork and Tolerance learners' code points for this activity. In the afternoon, the children got changed into their amazing costumes and we began learning about the Ancient Egyptians and produced a timeline. In English, the children have been producing some fantastic pieces of writing linked to our class book: Secrets of a Sun King. In Maths we are continuing to revise ready for SATs next week. We are currently looking at measurement. This includes calculating the area, perimeter and volume of chosen shapes and converting different units of measure. We are then applying our knowledge to a range of SATS practice questions. Please encourage your child to continue to read at least 3 times a week and complete any homework and revision pack materials. Thanks for your continued support.

Butterfly House

On Wednesday last week, our Year 1 and 2 children had a day out to the Tropical Butterfly House.

The Tropical Butterfly House is a tropical conservation park, homing over 140 different species!

The children enjoyed a day viewing, interacting with and learning about lots of different creatures, including some of their favourites.


